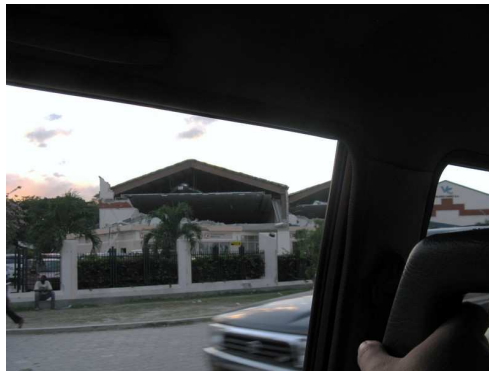


Haiti Earthquake Update 5



What a trip the last few days have been. It seems like weeks so far, but I'm sure it's worse for many that I've seen today.

We got going this morning and on the bus. There had been a lot of rumors about many different things going on between where we were and where we were headed, but we felt the Lord saying to go. We ended up having a US Army Sergeant on our bus. He is Haitian and lives in Miami so they deployed him right away. The picture you see attached is his wife in the red, he was sitting in the front of the bus, making most of us feel a lot safer.

Most of the people on the bus were from Haiti, but had moved to the US and were coming back to search for relatives and friends and help out in any way they can. There are a lot of hurting people everywhere we turn.

We had no issues whatsoever getting in to Port Au Prince. At the border I ran into a couple of friends I worked with in Louisiana a couple of years ago. We landed right next door to the American Embassy which was overflowing with people trying to get out of the country. Pastor Abraham and his son were waiting on us and his son took us to Mission of Hope just outside of Port Au Prince.

We arrived just as it was getting dark. This place is huge and very nice and they immediately began taking care of us and set us up with bunks to sleep on. We got unloaded and the PHC guys had some stuff to fix for dinner.

As I was walking up the hill to get the internet connection, there was Troy talking on his phone, the guy I saw at the border! What a small world!

We barely saw anything in Port Au Prince and as we wasted no time getting to our secure compound. There were seven of us in a 5 passenger vehicle plus our luggage, so even with what we did see, we didn't get many good pictures. They say there are still many after shocks going on and we've felt one so far.

Other than that, the plans are to get into town the next couple of days to assess what we can do and the best way to get it done. Just coming in today gave us huge insights into what the process will be until the airport opens back up and we have no idea when that will be.

People are really starting to get anxious as help is not getting to them as quick as they think it should. Continue to keep everyone and everything in your prayers.

We will be safe as always in the Lord's hands and will not put ourselves in any danger. We will have several Haitians with us as our guides and will get back to you as soon as we can. Our plans are still to be state side on Wednesday and we will communicate in more detail at that time.
